Public Art Walking Tour Saturday

Take a guided tour that will uncover the public art treasures of downtown Phoenix. Starting at the one-year-old Gallery@City Hall (Stop #45), you will explore the Phoenix Convention Center, swing pass the Herberger Theater Center, discover the sculpture at the Sheraton Hotel, walk through Taylor Mall, and conclude with "Her Secret is Patience" at Civic Space Park. Tours are scheduled on Saturday at 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. *Wear comfortable shoes!

This guided shuttle tour visits working artist studios in the Warehouse District. Jackson Street where it will visit four separate working artists studios before heading to the Popup Galleries at Bentley Projects. A self-guided tour of the incredible murals on 16th Street. Maps can be picked up at The Hive (Stop #91).

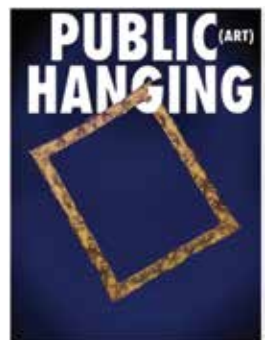
